1 Apologies

There were apologies from Sharon Ayto and Kevin O'Connor.

Moved Chairperson Johnstone, seconded Stewart Bull and resolved:

That the Taramea (Howell's Point) Management committee accept the apologies.

6 Confirmation of Minutes

Resolution

Moved Blair Stewart, seconded Stewart Bull and resolved:

That the minutes of Taramea (Howell's Point) Management Committee, held on 24 June 2020 be confirmed as a true and correct record of that meeting subject to an amendment to the Chairperson's report with the addition of a resolution....move Stewart Bull, second Blair Stewart and resolved that the Taramea (Howell's Point) Management Committee agree that the process to update/review the Taramea (Howell's Point) management plan proceed and which will include the aspirations of Ngai Tahu and discussion on the ongoing plan of a Marae being placed at Taramea (Howell's Point).....

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Updates

7.1 **Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu**

Te Ao Tūroa Puna Mahara Programme Leader - Aaron Leith and Senior Environmental Advisor - Julia Fettes were in attendance to address the committee on the process involved in reviewing and updating the Taramea (Howells Point) Management Plan.

Mr Leith provided background history of Taramea (Howell's Point) which was returned to Ngāi Tahu ownership under the Ngāi Tahu Claims Settlement Act 1998. A co-management regime was put in place between Ngāi Tahu and Council in respect of Taramea for the land to be administered "as if" it were a recreation reserve in accordance with the Reserves Act 1977.

It was noted that Ōraka Aparima Rūnaka have made a decision to proceed with assessment of Taramea as a site for the new marae premises on Section 31.

Mr Leith noted the proposed management plan review could be used to facilitate the marae development at Taramea.

Ms Fettes explained the process of reviewing and developing management plans involving a collaborative approach required with relevant parties.

Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu advice was that the Reserves Act 1977 management plan process need not be followed for the review. A bespoke process could be agreed to by the Taramea Management Committee to provide for the partnership between Ngāi Tahu and SDC, reflect TRONT ownership and in particular the immense cultural importance of Taramea to Ōraka Aparima Rūnaka as kaitiaki.

Mr Leith suggested an Advisory Group could be set up to assist the Southland District Council to prepare a new management plan for Taramea. A Terms of Reference for the Advisory Group would first be developed setting out: Background of Taramea, Purpose of Advisory Group, Membership, Engagement with community, Content of Management Plan, Management Plan process, Meetings of Advisory Group, Costs, Decision-making and Conflicts of interest.

It was agreed that to progress this staff from TRoNT / Ōraka Aparima Rūnaka and Council work collaboratively together to develop a process to undertake a review of the Taramea (Howells Point) Management Plan.

Resolution

Moved Chairperson Johnstone, seconded Blair Stewart and resolved:

That the Taramea (Howell's Point) Management Committee:

a) Requests that a process be developed between Southland District Council and Te Rūnanga o Ngãi Tahu to work collaboratively together to undertake an update / review of the Taramea (Howell's Point) Management Plan.

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7.2 Landscapes Project - Review of Natural Features and Landscapes Chapter of the District Plan

Record No: R/20/10/61139

Group Manager, Environmental Services - Fran Mikulicic and Team leader-resource management - Marcus Roy were in attendance for this item.

Mr Roy advised the purpose of the **report is to inform the Taramea (Howell's Point)**Management Committee about the work the resource management department is doing to identify outstanding natural landscapes and features within the District.

Mr Roy explained the key reasons for doing this work are:

- to look after our special landscapes for now and for future generations
- legal requirements under the Resource Management Act 1991 to identify and protect our special areas
- Council has requested a review of what is currently in the District Plan relating to landscapes.

Resolution

Moved Blair Stewart, seconded Stewart Bull and resolved:

That the Taramea (Howell's Point) Management Committee:

a) Receives the report titled "Landscapes Project - Review of Natural Features and Landscapes Chapter of the District Plan" dated 15 October 2020.

7.3 Kaiwhakahaere Report

Chairperson Muriel Johnstone presented this report.

Chairperson Johnstone drew a number of issues to the attention of the committee including:

- re-alignment of the walking track
- new wooden seating
- directional signage
- tree maintenance
- vandalism
- small fire in the harakeke

Topics that Chairperson Johnstone referred during her update have been attached to the minutes as appendix 1.

Blair Stewart provided an update on activities he has been involved which included:

- installation of stoat trap
- advice of purchase of seats built by Wayne Hill which have been placed at Taramea (Howell's Point) and Mitchells Bay with a request for reimbursement of \$300 - the meeting agreed a payment be made to Wayne Hill for \$300 to be funded from reserves
- advice that thistles/broom require spraying Mr Stewart to organise and undertake work

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• advice of offer from members of the public to clear slashings/rubbish under the trees at a cost of \$500.

Following discussion on health and safety requirements /regulations for this activity it was agreed staff obtain a quote from an approved contractor and liaise with the Chair to progress this work.

The Chair invited Stewart Bull to conclude the meeting with a Karakia.
