1 Apologies

There were apologies from Andrea Straith.

5 Confirmation of minutes

Resolution

That the Waihopai Toetoe Community Board confirms the minutes of the meeting held on 27 August 2024 as a true and correct record of that meeting.

6 Public participation

Judy Diane addressed the board about the removal of trees and shelter belts on public land. She particularly highlighted the removal of the hedge at the Gorge Road recreation ground and the garden plots in Tokanui.

Reports

7.1 Tokanui garden plot infill - unbudgeted expenditure request

Record No: R/24/8/53537

Community facilities manager – Mark Day was in attendance for this item.

The purpose of the report was to seek approval for unbudgeted expenditure for the removal of the garden plots between 2819 Tokanui Gorge Road Highway and the



intersection of McEwan Street Tokanui and the reinstatement of the road pavement. This work is to funded by a loan.

The Board had requested that the four gardens on the northern side of the Tokanui Gorge Road Highway be removed (including the small garden on the corner of the highway and McEwan Street.

After discussion, it was clear that further information from the councils transport department would need to be sought for roading requirements and that the report would lie on the table.

Resolution

7.2 Gorge Road hedge and tree removal - unbudgeted expenditure request (and change in funding source for speed feedback signs)

Record No: R/24/9/55429

Community facilities manager – Mark Day was in attendance for this item.

The purpose of the report was to seek approval for unbudgeted expenditure to be funded from reserves for the removal of the western and northern boundary hedges and two monkey puzzle trees at the Gorge Road recreation reserve.

Following discussion, the Board would not be agreeing to the change in funding source for the speed feedback signs.

Resolution

Moved Chairperson Yorke, seconded Cr Keast recommendation a to d and e (with changes as indicated) and resolved:

That the Waihopai Toetoe Community Board:

- a) Receives the report titled "Gorge Road hedge and tree removal unbudgeted expenditure request".
- b) Determines that this matter or decision be recognised as not significant in terms of section 76 of the Local Government Act 2002.
- c) Determines that it has complied with the decision-making provisions of the Local Government Act 2002 to the extent necessary in relation to this decision; and in accordance with section 79 of the act determines that it does not require further information, further assessment of options or further analysis of costs and benefits or advantages and disadvantages prior to making a decision on this matter.



- d) Agrees to recommend to Council unbudgeted expenditure of up to \$20,000 for the removal of hedges and trees at the Gorge Road recreation reserve to be funded from the Gorge Road General Reserve.
- e) <u>Does not agree</u> that the funding source for speed feedback signs at Gorge Road for projects FFOOT107 and FFOOT110 be changed to a 15-year loan repaid from the Waihopai Toetoe Community Board rate.

- Communications included in the Ensign and Southland Express newspapers regard the pre-engagement for the review of the 2015 Dong Control Bylaw and 2015 Freedom Camping Bylaw
- The granting of use for an event in Doctors Square

- Cardigan Road flood mitigation issues (spraying and cleaning of ditch not undertaken for two plus years)
