# A.1 Extraordinary vacancy on the Oraka Aparima Community Board

#### Record No: R/25/6/26705

GM strategy and partnerships, Vibhuti Chopra explained that an extraordinary vacancy has arisen on the board with the resignation of Albert Buchanan. Mr Buchanan resigned by providing notice in writing to Council's chief executive on 5 June 2025.

When a vacancy arises within 12 months of a local government election, the chief executive must notify the board immediately.

After being notified, the board must then make a resolution at a meeting to either:

- fill the vacancy by appointing a specific person to the board (who is qualified to be elected as a member), or
- to not fill the vacancy.

Eight months ago, a group of community minded volunteers - The Colar Bay Progress League - took on Endraising \$108,000 to replace an about to be demolished Surfer statue

Working with S.D.C. we were shown the possible options and formed a view of now much needed to be vaised to replace our statue. The total estimate was \$140,000. S. D. C. already had in its budget \$31,335 for the surfer stature. This was alcan approved by the C.B. and is already incorporated into current rates. We understood we needed to find the rest / and or secure a loan from S.D.C. That would need to be repaid by the vatepayors.

Our goal has always been to avoid any increase to rates for vale payors, Although we were considering a loan on a temporary basis if it meant we could speed up the procurrement process.

To date \$41,000 has been vaised by the Progress heague.

We have norked have offering a vange of fundraising options from boadies and postus for sale, to quizzes and business sponsorship.

We have veceived incredible support from local businesses and our communifies.

Our latest Tostrot Flats Superquiz fundraiser was overwhelming in terms of that support, \$11,000 raised from 28 autotion items donated by local businesses.

Raising \$41k in eight months is a mightly achievement. For 25 years, it has been an iconic part of Colac Bay's identity. It has heralded in a massive increase in popularity of surfing and still remains the only surfer Statue in New Zealand.
