Election of chair and deputy chair

Purpose

- 1 To elect a chairperson and deputy chairperson in accordance with clauses 25 and 26, Schedule 7 of the Local Government Act 2002.

Staff recommendations

That the Ohai Railway Fund Committee:

- a) notes the information contained in the report.
- b) notes that the matter or decision in this report is assessed as administrative based on Council's Significance and Engagement Policy. On this basis the Committee are not carrying out any engagement.
- c) determines that it has complied with the decision-making provisions of the Local Government Act 2002 to the extent necessary in relation to this decision; and in accordance with Section 79 of the act determines that it does not require further information, further assessment of options or further analysis of costs and benefits or advantages and disadvantages prior to making a decision on this matter.
- d) agrees to use voting system A to elect the chair and deputy chair.
- e) elects an Ohai Railway Fund Committee member to be the chair of the Ohai Railway Fund Committee for the 2025/2028 triennium.

Executive summary

- 2 All Ohai Railway Fund Committee representatives are eligible to be nominated to be chair or deputy chair of the committee.
- 3 The chairperson runs each meeting and they are a key point of contact for the committee (both for the public and for council staff).
- 4 The committee must decide the voting system to use to elect the chair and deputy chair. Clause 25 of schedule 7 of the act stipulates that a voting system must be used for these appointments and the options for this are outlined below.
- 5 There are two options for voting – system A and system B.

- 6
- (3) System A—
 - (a) requires that a person is elected or appointed if he or she receives the votes of a majority of the members of the local authority or committee present and voting; and
 - (b) has the following characteristics:
 - (i) there is a first round of voting for all candidates; and
 - (ii) if no candidate is successful in that round there is a second round of voting from which the candidate with the fewest votes in the first round is excluded; and
 - (iii) if no candidate is successful in the second round there is a third, and if necessary subsequent, round of voting from which, each time, the candidate with the fewest votes in the previous round is excluded; and
 - (iv) in any round of voting, if 2 or more candidates tie for the lowest number of votes, the person excluded from the next round is resolved by lot.
 - (4) System B—
 - (a) requires that a person is elected or appointed if he or she receives more votes than any other candidate; and
 - (b) has the following characteristics:
 - (i) there is only 1 round of voting; and
 - (ii) if 2 or more candidates tie for the most votes, the tie is resolved by lot.

- 7 Once the voting system has been determined, the committee can then proceed to elect the chairperson and deputy chairperson.

Context

- 8 Each Council committee is required to have a chairperson and may also wish to appoint a deputy chairperson. The deputy chairperson will be called on to fulfil the duties of the chairperson if he or she is unable to perform his or her duties. All committee members are eligible to be nominated for these roles.

Discussion

The voting systems

- 9 There are no requirements for a formal nomination – the mayor, or their nominee, will call for nominations at the meeting. Representatives may be nominated for these roles in absentia (if they are not present on the day of this meeting), but those who are absent cannot vote.
- 10 The system of voting for the position of chairperson and deputy chairperson is by using either system A or B.
- 11 System A outlines that a person is elected if he or she receives the votes of a majority of the members or representatives of the local authority or committee present and voting.
- 12 System A works by having a first round of voting for all candidates. If no candidate is successful in that round there is a second round of voting from which the candidate with the fewest votes in the first round is excluded. Then if no candidate is successful in the second round there is a third, and if necessary subsequent, round of voting from which, each time, the candidate with the fewest votes in the previous round is excluded. Should the result be tied, then the decision is decided by lot. This could be the toss of a coin or by drawing a name out of a hat.
- 13 System B requires that a person is elected or appointed if he or she receives more votes than any other candidate.
- 14 System B works by there being only 1 round of voting; and if 2 or more candidates tie for the most votes, the tie is resolved by lot (toss of a coin or by drawing a name out of a hat.).

- 15 In accordance with voting procedures, the committee is called on to elect representatives to the position of chairperson and, if it chooses to do so, to appoint a deputy chairperson.

Term of office

- 16 The term of office for the chairperson and, if appointed, the deputy chairperson of the committee shall be for the duration of the 2025/2028 triennium. However, a representative may terminate (or have terminated) their office by:
- resigning as chairperson or deputy chairperson
 - a majority decision of the committee
 - being no longer eligible to hold office.

The role of the chairperson

- 17 The chairperson is responsible for ensuring that the decisions of the committee are consistent with the powers delegated to it by Council. The chairperson is responsible for ensuring that the conduct of business is carried out in an orderly way and in accordance with standing orders, and any other statute that may apply from time-to-time.
- 18 The role of chairperson includes:
- chairing meetings
 - review agendas with appropriate staff
 - addressing delegated routine matters outside of a committee meeting
 - managing media enquiries relating committee business.

The role of the deputy chairperson

- 19 If the chairperson is absent or incapacitated, the deputy chairperson must perform all of the responsibilities and duties, and exercise any powers, of the chairperson:
- with the consent of the chairperson at any time during the temporary absence of the chairperson
 - without that consent, at any time while the chairperson is prevented by illness or some other cause from performing the responsibilities and duties, or exercising the powers, of his or her role
 - while there is a vacancy for the role of chairperson.
- 20 In the absence of proof to the contrary, a deputy chairperson acting as chairperson is presumed to have the authority to do so.
- 21 A deputy chairperson continues to hold his or her position so long as he or she continues to be a representative of the committee or until the election of his or her successor, or until the close of the 2025/2028 triennium.

Options

- 22 The following reasonably practicable options have been identified and assessed in this report:

Option 1 - the committee electing a chairperson (and if it wishes, a deputy chairperson) by using voting system A

Option 2 - the committee electing a chairperson (and if it wishes, a deputy chairperson) by using voting system B.

Recommended option

- 23 It is recommended that the committee proceed with option 1 and elect a chairperson (and if it wishes, a deputy chairperson) by using voting system A.

Option 1 – Voting system A

Advantages	Disadvantages

Legal considerations

- 24 Clause 25 of schedule 7 of the Local Government Act 2002 outlines that the committee must use one of the two systems of voting for the election of the chair and deputy chair.

Strategic alignment

Strategic direction

- 25 The election of a chairperson is a statutory requirement.

Financial considerations

- 26 The chairperson and deputy chairperson are voluntary positions and there are no associated funding considerations.

Significance assessment

- 27 This decision has been assessed as being of some importance/administrative under Council's Significance and Engagement Policy.

Executive summary

- 2 This report proposes the committee adopt a schedule of meetings for the triennium.
- 3 Adopting a schedule makes it clear to committee members, the public and staff when meetings will be held. The Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act 1987 has requirements about how meetings should be publicly notified - the schedule helps staff met those requirements.
- 4 It is proposed that the committee will meet two times a year, in May and November, and that the final meeting of the triennium be held in late September 2028. The last meeting for the triennium must be held a little early due to the triennial Council election being held on Saturday 14 October 2028.

Options

5 The following reasonably practicable options have been identified and assessed in this report:

Option 1 – adopt a meeting schedule.

Option 2 – not adopt a meeting schedule.

Recommended option:

6 It is recommended that the committee proceed with Option 1 and adopt a meeting schedule.

Legal considerations

7 The committee is not legally required to adopt a schedule of meetings, but a schedule does make it clear when meetings will be held and it makes it easier for staff to meet legal requirements. The statutory requirements committee meetings are outlined in the Local Government Act 2002 and the Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act 1987.

Financial considerations

8 The only costs associated with adopting a meeting schedule are providing the public notice about meetings via the newspaper. One advert is run each month for all meetings.

Purpose

- 1 This report details Ohai Railway Fund's financial position for the year ended 30 June 2025 and the current year 1 July 2025 to 31 January 2026. It also seeks feedback about whether Ohai Railway Fund reserves should be classified as either an unrestricted or restricted reserve in relation to how it should be invested.

Staff recommendations

That the Ohai Railway Fund Committee:

- a) notes the information contained in the report.
 - b) provides feedback about the preferred classification of Ohai Railway Fund reserves for future investment as either:
 - i) unrestricted reserve (e.g. balanced fund investment)
 - ii) restricted reserve (e.g. bank account/term deposit)
- 2 Financial report The following information provides a summary of the financial information related to the Ohai Railway Fund for the prior year and current year to date with detailed tables below.

Prior year - year ended 30 June 2025

- 3 The fund recorded a surplus of \$23,052 for the year ended 30 June 2025, slightly below the \$24,889 budgeted. The \$1,837 variance resulted from higher than budgeted grant expenditure (\$11,747), partially offset by higher interest income (\$9,910). This surplus was transferred to the reserve.
- 4 Grants during the year totalled \$66,747 compared to \$55,000 budgeted. A breakdown of the grants issued are shown in the notes under the financial information tables below.
- 5 Actual interest received was \$90,999 compared to \$81,089 budgeted, due to interest rates being higher than forecast (4.82% actual versus 4.40% budget).
- 6 As a result, the reserve closing value was \$1,933,944, slightly lower than the \$1,935,781 budgeted.

Current year to date - 1 July 2025 to 31 January 2026

- 7 The surplus for the year to date is nil because interest is only calculated at year end, and no grants have been issued while the committee was being re-established after the elections last year.
- 8 In 2025/2026 \$55,000 is budgeted to be allocated through grants, with no allocations made to date. Interest income on reserves is budgeted at \$82,184 (4.40%).

If the actual grant allocation exceeds the actual interest income or the actual interest is lower than budgeted at year end, then any shortfall will need to be funded from the reserve.

(i) Interest

Interest rate paid to 30 June 2025 was calculated at 4.85% based on the average RBNZ six month term deposit rate for the 12 months ended 30 June 2025.

Budgeted interest rate to 30 June 2025 is 4.40% based on LTP.

Interest income for the year will be calculated using the relevant interest rate at 30 June 2026.

All reserve funds (including the Ohai Railway Fund reserve) are pooled together for investment purposes. At the end of each financial year Council allocates interest to each reserve, based on the average balance of the year.

Future investment approach - feedback sought

- 9 Council has recently updated its Investment and Liability Management Policy which sets out how reserves will be invested. This includes classifying reserves as restricted or unrestricted.
- 10 Some reserves, including the Ohai Railway Fund, have not yet been given a final classification and the committee is being asked for its view on the preferred investment approach.
- 11 The classification matters because it determines where and how the reserves can be invested:
 - **unrestricted reserves** may be invested in **balanced funds** (higher risk, held for long period, can withstand fluctuating returns, higher long term return)
 - **restricted reserves** must be invested in **bank accounts like term deposits or client fund accounts** (low risk, smaller but more stable returns).
- 12 Balanced funds are invested in a mix of things like shares, bonds and property. Because these investments can go up and down in value, they carry more risk than putting money into a bank term deposit, which is generally very stable. This means a balanced fund can earn higher returns over time, but it can also earn less than a bank, and in some years it may even lose value. For this reason, balanced funds are usually chosen for long-term investing, where the money can stay invested for several years and has time to recover from any short-term ups and downs.
- 13 Staff are seeking feedback from the committee on its preferred investment approach for the Ohai Railway Fund, either as an unrestricted reserve (invested in a long-term balanced fund) or as a restricted reserve (invested in the bank).
- 14 This feedback will be provided to Council, who will make the final decision. Any implications of that decision will be discussed with the committee at a future meeting.

Next steps

- 15 Updated financial reports will be provided to the committee at future meetings to show any grants issued or interest allocated at year end.
- 16 Staff will also advise Council of the committee's feedback on the preferred classification for Ohai Railway Fund reserves as either unrestricted or restricted reserves with this then to be decided by Council.

- 4 A copy of the applications is attached to this report.
- 5 There is \$55,000 budgeted to spend in grant allocations for the 2025/2026 financial year.
- 6 If all applications are approved, \$6,700 will be allocated from this budget.

Context

- 7 The purpose of the Ohai Railway Fund is to provide grants for the benefit of the residents of the former Ohai Railway Board area. Individuals may apply for assistance towards tertiary study or international opportunities, and local community groups may also apply to the fund for project assistance. Organisation applications are dealt with in a separate report.
- 8 Individuals may apply for assistance with post secondary, adult education assistance, or international opportunities and must either reside in the area or be a descendant of a person who resided in the area for any consecutive nine year period between 1960 and 2020 (both years inclusive).
- 9 Allocations are made based on whether the applicant is a resident or non resident and if they are completing a long (over 12 months) or short (12 months or less) course.
- 10 The Ohai Railway Fund Committee, is a committee of Southland District Council, and will be subject to Southland District Council's Code of Conduct and Standing Orders.

Discussion

- 11 The applications received are summarised and attached to this report. The committee members, as members of the community within the Ohai Railway Fund boundary, will assess the applications and their eligibility for funding and will decide if and how much to allocate according to the policy. The allocation amounts are detailed in the summary document attached.

Options

- 12 The following reasonably practicable options have been identified and assessed in this report:
Option 1 – agrees to fund the September 2025 applications in accordance with the terms of reference.
Option 2 – declines to fund the September 2025 applications.

- 15 The purpose of the Ohai Railway Fund is to provide grants for the benefit of the residents of the former Ohai Railway Board area and delivers on the social and cultural outcomes outlined in the current Long Term Plan (LTP). By funding individuals for their education opportunities and initiatives such as sports, recreation, health services and community programmes, the fund promotes wellbeing, fosters a sense of belonging, and enhances facilities that make the area attractive and liveable.
- 16 The funding decisions covered in this report reflect these objectives, ensuring that allocations contribute to the LTP vision of vibrant, connected communities and opportunities to thrive.

Policy and plan consistency

- 17 There are no inconsistencies identified.

Financial considerations

- 18 Costs relating to Ohai Railway Fund grants are budgeted for annually. As per the financial report, there is \$55,000 budgeted to allocate for the 2025/2026 financial year. The committee may choose to spend over this amount if they wish.
- 19 If all applications are granted the total amount for the tertiary applications for this round will be \$6,700.

Significance assessment

- 20 This decision has been assessed in accordance with Council’s Significance and Engagement Policy as having some importance or administrative and is not considered significant.
- 21 The allocation of these funds follows the Ohai Railway fund policy, and the allocations are within the budgeted fund allowances. The decision provides minor positive impact on Council’s social and cultural community outcomes in terms of this policy and has no impact on the provisions of Council’s level of services. This decision is reversible but there would be some hurdles to do so.

- 22 The assessed level of significance indicates that the community is kept informed of the decisions made in this report, rather than engaged prior to the decision being made.

- 15 Costs relating to Ohai Railway Fund grants are budgeted for annually. As per the financial report, there is \$55,000 budgeted to allocate for the 2025/2026 financial year. The committee may choose to spend over this amount if they wish.
- 16 The total amount requested for this round is \$2,000.

Significance assessment

- 17 This decision has been assessed in accordance with Council's Significance and Engagement Policy as having some importance or administrative and is not considered significant.
- 18 The allocation of these funds follows the Ohai Railway fund policy, and the allocations are within the budgeted fund allowances. The decision provides minor positive impact on Council's social and cultural community outcomes in terms of this policy and has no impact on the provisions of Council's level of services. This decision is reversible but there would be some hurdles to do so. Allocations of grants do follow an accountability process, where applicants are required to submit a report detailing how the funds were spent and confirming that they were spent on the agreed purpose.
- 19 The assessed level of significance indicates that the community is kept informed of the decisions made in this report, rather than engaged prior to the decision being made.
